Dan & Elanie Ju

Dan Jue was born in China in the 1930s and immigrated to the United States when he was 11 years old. He trained as an Engineer, a field Dan worked in for over 30 years before becoming a missionary. Elaine, his wife served in Bible Study Fellowship for many years in various capacities.



Dan and Elaine have been with Sunset Church of San Francisco, California (aka Sunset Baptist Church), since its founding days in the nineteen seventies.

Sunset sent them out as missionaries to Argentina in 1993. While there, they served in the city of San Nicholas to bring unity to the Argentine churches. Then in 1997 they went to Urumqi in the province of Xinjiang in China. For 13 years they

worked among believers in the underground house churches which included discipleship and encouraging Uyghur church leaders. Dan appointed deacons and elders in a church that grew from a handful to over a hundred and which met illegally in four or five apartment homes every Sunday. In 2010, their mission agency, Ethnos-Asia, called them to go to Vientiane Laos to help establish a Chinese church. Based in Laos they minister to groups of believers in the access restricted nations on the rim of the southern border of China, including ethnic Tibetans in Nepal. They still continue to go to Xinjiang to encourage the houses churches and the Uyghur leaders.

Alvin Allan - Director MO

Alvin has served on the Board of Mission Outreach for over 10 years and became the Director in 2011. He has lead teams to Xinjiang province in North West China, where they once carried in over 500kg of literature for the underground church, by hand.

In 2009 they were caught by the Chinese authorities while distributing copies of the Jesus film in the Uyghur language. They saw many miracles as the Lord got them and the materials they were carrying into this heavily restricted area.

He will travelling with Dan& Elaine and speaking in churches with Elaine.
